Welcome back everyone to our new term! The children have settled in well back into school. This week we have begun exploring our local links to the community through PSHE and the children had a walk through Lowick village to make connections to the past as well as to what the village is like today. We will be following this up with a community lunch where we will be inviting our local community (Lowick and Holy Island) into Lowick school for lunch on Friday 7th February - more information about this will be available shortly.

Mrs Cochrane is using the theme of animals to teach the children about constructing sentences in French and she is inspired by Peter and the Wolf for music this half term also. In geography, we are focusing on map skills, coordinates and directions to complement our work in history on codebreaking. In codebreaking we will be looking at different ways of creating codes, secret writing, morse code, flags and more about Alan Turing's work in World War 2. This week, the children enjoyed making invisible ink and writing messages to each other. The older children reflected on the advantages and disadvantages of using lemon juice as ink.

In RE, we are thinking about 'What is it like to follow God?' based on the story of Abraham from the Old Testament and also learning more about the Salvation Army.
