

Class one has been looking at the story Traction Man. This week they have talked about how traction man reminds them of other superheroes. Together they have been focussing on describing their personalities and abilities. They then made themselves into a superhero and described what kind of hero they would be.

In class two they have been finding out how water is transported within plants in science. The celery and flowers have been soaking up red dyed water and the children have had the chance to dissect the celery and examine the transportation of the red coloured water through the structure of the plant. In RE the children are learning about Jewish beliefs and have made mezuzahs which some Jewish people use to keep the word of God in their minds by having prayer scrolls inside them and attaching them to their door frames. Older children have been considering the differences between how Orthodox Jewish people and Reform Jewish people mark Shabbat.
