



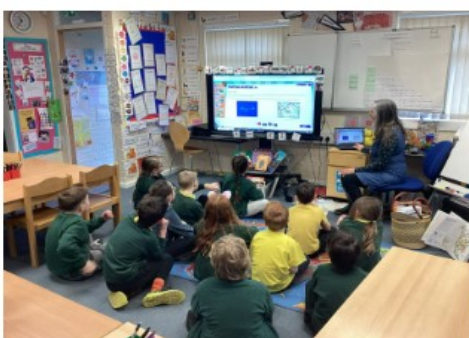

In PSHE the children have been thinking about community and the younger children have been thinking in particular about the rules we have in our school to make it safe and happy. In computing the children have been thinking about digital media presentations and information including using software to create presentations and add audio.



STEM Day this term - the Code Show

We are very excited to have booked the Code Show to come to school on **21st February**. Gary from the Code Show is also a primary teacher (and ex aerospace engineer) and familiar with working with children from Reception up to year 6. Parents and carers are able to come into school for an after school session 3 - 4pm as well. The day should be exciting and very interactive. To quote his website:

"We arrive in school with 15-18 vintage computers spanning 5 decades in addition to handheld technology, storage media, vintage processors and historical consumer technology including video recorders, typewriters, 1980s mobile phones, Sony Walkman. Finally our 1985 Sinclair C5 electric vehicle joins the roadshow promoting STEM areas, identifying that electric vehicles are not a new phenomenon..."

Students have full access to the machines as well as an opportunity for them to type in program listings into the computers and experience software from the era. We will quickly have students programming and engaging with the machines, whether that be loading software or coding from type in listings."
