

We have had a good week with the children settling into routines and working hard in their lessons. In maths the children are learning about place value including reasoning and problem solving as part of their regular practice. Reception children are learning about number in a very practical way - collecting the right amount of leaves and twigs to make a 'hedgehog hibernation station'! In school, we take a CPA approach to maths - Concrete resources, Pictorial representations and Abstract representations. This translates into making it, showing or recognising it and decoding or writing it mathematically. Having a combination of these together helps the children make connections in maths and link practical knowledge with theoretical knowledge.







In history, the children have enjoyed sharing their toys from when they were very young and thinking about how toys have changed over just a short amount of time. They will be extending this time frame over the course of this topic. In Commando Joe's the children had a mission which needed memorising skills to copy and build Mr Graham's display. They needed to communicate and work together as a team to successfully complete the mission - well done everyone!


